

July Updates Rev. Dr. Benjamin J. Broadbent, Lead Minister

Meaningful work continues at Community Church this summer and I am grateful that so many people are stepping into leadership positions. Here is an update on what is happening this month:

- The long-awaited **Sanctuary Roof Project** will begin, thanks to some recent congregational votes and a commitment to launch a Capital Campaign this fall. Workers will remove the old shingles and repair any dry rot underneath. Then they will hang new shingles and install a clear cap complete with solar-powered panels that will open to release heat. The large stained-glass window in the sanctuary and the Bell Tower in the courtyard will be removed prior to the roof work, to be replaced after completion of a successful campaign.
- Our Sanctuary Congregation designation continues to guide our church's commitment to standing in solidarity with immigrants and other marginalized and vulnerable people. Thank you to the Faith In Action Team, chaired by Jenny Douglas and Judy Davison, for keeping our congregation engaged. Join people of faith from throughout Sonoma County on Wednesday, July 2, 7:00 a.m. 7:00 p.m. for an "Interfaith Fast for Migrants" culminating in a Silent Vigil, 5:00 7:00 p.m. in Old Courthouse Square.



• A low-key **Evacuation Drill** will take place at the end of the worship service on July

6. It will not be a surprise. We will practice leaving the sanctuary and gathering at our designated Evacuation Point in the Danmar Parking Lot. Thank you to our Health & Safety Team for coordinating this and other programs to ensure the safety of all who use our church facility.

• Our Associate Minister Search Committee, co-chaired by Rachel Allen & Alvin Hukins, continues to meet, updating our congregation's Local Church Profile, circulating the Associate Minister Job Description, and preparing to interview potential candidates. The committee's work is necessarily confidential but be assured they are working well together and discerning the guidance of the Holy Spirit in this important process.

Muriel is from Gaelic folk in the Scottish Highlands—a place of strong accents, coastal waters, peat bogs,

whiskey, and reels. Her childhood unfolded in the differing parsonages where her father preached. What remained constant was her conservative faith community.

"I was brought up with stark either-or concepts," Muriel reflects. "You're either in or you're out... you're a Christian, or you're going to hell. But over time, I became interested in other ways of thinking about Christianity and was not always so convinced with what was being said in the conservative church."



When she and her husband moved to Sebastopol, they weren't looking for anything in particular, they weren't even searching. "We kept passing Community Church. So, one day we just decided to go." What they discovered was a community more liberal than what they were accustomed to, but one that offered exactly what they needed.

Over the next 40 years, Community Church became a weekly anchor for Muriel's life that still holds strong today. She credits the ritual of Sunday worship, the educational faith formation hours, the women's groups, and the deep fellowship she finds there with keeping her life on track and even helping her age more gracefully.

"Most of all, I appreciate that the values of the gospel are continued to be spoken of as the main points of our life," Muriel shares. "If I'm going to follow those footsteps, I want to hear about them, because it's not easy to be a real Christian. I mean, sacrificial love, give me a break. That's hard, really hard. I need the encouragement and the depth of the ministry to help me do it."

Today, Muriel finds herself embracing a more inclusive understanding of faith. "Just the other day," she said, "it was like I heard God saying to me, 'Yes, Muriel, it takes all kinds. And that's the way it's been set up.'"

After decades of church attendance, her faith remains fresh and growing. "Even at 80 years, I got something new just this past Easter," she shares, describing how Christ's words to "forgive them, they don't know what they're doing" suddenly took on new meaning, transforming her attitude toward others in all areas of life.

Once constrained by rigid spiritual boundaries, Muriel now describes herself poetically as being "from Holy grace"– a woman whose faith embraces complexity, whose heart remains open to new understandings, and whose spiritual home at Community Church continues to nourish her growing faith.

Your generosity to Community Church makes it possible for us to surround community members like Muriel with meaningful worship, faith formation, and fellowship. Thank you for being a part of this ministry we all share.

"Dreams come in the service of health and wholeness." This is one of the core principles of our weekly dreamwork group. We gather to share our dreams in a safe, supportive, collaborative space to help shed light on the deeper meanings and practical applications of our dreams and to discover how they might help us gain new understandings and insights.

Because "all dreams speak a universal language" (another foundational principle of good dreamwork!) we all learn together in the sharing of each dream. Together we discover the universal wisdom that our dreams and dream images offer us – often profound spiritual insights and new perspectives on our life's journey.

In our group, we all share from our own life experiences -- what it would mean to us if we were to have a dream like the one being shared. We speak in terms of "If this were my dream..." so that we all own our own projections and refrain from any judgements or advice-giving. This allows whoever is sharing their dream to be the final authority over what the dream means to them.

It is really wonderous to hear the multiple perspectives and diverse interpretations of a dream. In fact, one of the most satisfying moments in our dreamwork group is when one of us has an "Aha!" of recognition or insight. And it happens often in our group -- sometimes rippling throughout the group – those wonderful "goosebump" moments!

So come and join in the fun, creative, enlivening, and enlightening process of working with the gift of our dreams. You can come just to hear the insights of others and just maybe have some of your own. No prior experience working with dreams is necessary. All are welcome! We will continue to meet during the summer months. Our dreams don't take a summer break!

Check Request / Expense Reimbursement Process Community Church of Sebastopol

Our check request process is intended to honor the time and resources of volunteers and staff. Thank you for doing your best to follow these procedures:

- 1. When an expense is anticipated, a staff or council person should be consulted to clarify which budget line should be charged and whether there are ample funds available. *This is one way the church faithfully manages its financial resources.*
- 2. Documentation, such as an invoice or receipt, is required to provide a check or reimbursement. *This procedure helps us practice financial transparency.*
- 3. A Check Request (Reimbursement) Form must be filled out by the person who incurred the expense. If known, the budget line name and number should be included on the form. *This information allows the Bookkeeper to keep accurate records by charging the expense to the correct budget line.*
- 4. The form must be authorized with a signature by two appropriate Leadership Council or Staff Team member (See **Resource Areas** below). *This provides clear oversight of budget-ary spending.*

Each budget line pertains to one of 3 Resource Areas (Finances, Personnel, Facilities) or 4 Ministry Areas (Worship & Arts, Faith Formation, Care & Fellowship, Outreach). Authorization is made by one of the two Council-Staff Partners associated with each Area. For 2025, these are the partners:
